

## fall faux sangria

16 to 30 servings

1 each of the  
following: orange,  
apple, peach, lemon  
4 cups apple juice  
½ cup lemon juice  
2 cups orange juice,  
strained  
1 cup white grape juice  
½ cup sparkling  
pomegranate soda

Combine thinly sliced  
fruit with juices (check  
in beats) in a pitcher.  
Chill for two hours.  
Add soda just before  
serving over ice.  
You can sub red wine  
for the soda, add in  
with fruit and juices  
before chilling.
